Overview:

This session will address aspects of managing greens, tees and fairways to meet the expectations of demanding golfers. Practices such as site assessment, plant exology, fertility, mowing, and irrigation as well as rolling, topdressing and cultivation with an emphasis on reducing chemical pesticide use based on our research at Bethpage State Park

Dr. Frank Rossi is the New York Extension Turfgrass Specialist and Associate Professor of Turfgrass Science at Cornell University. He received Associates degree from Cobleskill, Bachelors and Masters from URI and Ph.D. from Cornell University. He served on the faculties at Michigan State University and University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Frank conducts research and outreach education programs in golf and sports turf focused on environmentally responsible management. He also leads the teaching program on golf and sports turf management at Cornell. He is a Contributing Editor for TurfNet Newsletter and TurfNet.com where he has been writing a column for ten years.

Frank has published dozens of scientific research articles and is well known for his thought-provoking talks.

In addition to his work in turf, Frank is the father of three children, a triathlete, an artisan cheesemaker and alpaca farmer.
